# Structure, governance and management

#### Type of governing document

Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation under Section 105 of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, with a constitution (which is available on request). The relevant sections of the constitution are copied below.

#### **Trustee Recruitment and Appointment**

In accordance with the Constitution of the 4 Winds, Trustees are appointed by the Community Councils of the 4 communities that 4 Winds serves. In addition, the Trustees of 4 Winds may co-opt additional trustees.

#### 8.2 Appointed Trustees

8.2.1 Each of the Community Councils within the Communities, namely of

Lochgelly, Cowdenbeath, Lumphinnans and Auchtertool, or their respective successors, shall elect two individuals as Appointed Trustees. For the avoidance of doubt, these individuals do not have to be Community Councillors, but may be.

- 8.2.2 At each AMM any Appointed Trustee may choose to stand down, and any Trustee wishing to do so should notify the Board in writing as well as the community council he or she represents.
- 8.2.3 The normal term of office will be four years to coincide with the Community Council terms. A retiring Appointed Trustee shall retain office until the close or adjournment of the meeting.
- 8.2.4 Serving Trustees are eligible for re-election without limit.

8.2.5 If any of the Community Councils within the Community should cease to exist, any successor thereto shall take their place. If there is no such successor body, community representation on the Board of Trustees will be ensured by advertising the two Trustee vacancies per lapsed Community Council within the area of the Communities previously served by that lapsed Community Council. Nominations from within the area previously served by that lapsed Community Council will then be accepted. Should more than two nominations be received, Trustees for that area will be appointed following a community vote, the form of which will be decided by the existing Charity Trustees. This process will be publicly advertised.

#### 8.4 Co-opted Trustees

Up to two individuals (who do not need to be eligible to be members in terms of Clause 5.1.1, but who must be either ordinarily resident in or have their principal place of business within the Communities) may be co-opted from time to time by the Board of Trustees itself, as follows:

- 8.4.1 Subject to Clause 8.4.3, a Co-opted Trustee shall serve until the next AMM after his or her co-option.
- 8.4.2 A Co-opted Trustee can be re-co-opted by the Board immediately after such next AMM.
- 8.4.3 A Co-opted Trustee can be removed from office at any time by a simple majority of the Board.
- 8.4.4 For the avoidance of doubt, a Co-opted Trustee may participate fully in and vote at all Board meetings which he or she attends.

## Objectives and activities

#### Charitable purposes

The Charitable Purposes of the SCIO ("the Charitable Purposes") are to improve the conditions of life of all residents of, and to develop, the Communities by:

- 3.1.1 conserving the local environment for the benefit of the Communities:
- 3.1.2 supporting both community facilities and community groups within the Communities in order to promote and encourage active citizenship and community spirit, cohesion and development; and
- 3.1.4 supporting or encouraging recreational and educational activities within the Communities.

#### Summary of the main activities

4 Winds considers applications for funding from community groups in the 4 communities (Lochgelly, Cowdenbeath, Lumphinnans and Auchtertool) for financial support, subject to the 'Charitable Purposes' noted and our scoring matrix (which is available on request).

#### **Achievements and performance**

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The 4 Winds Trust has supported a diverse group of community projects in this financial year. This has included Lochgelly Christmas Lights, Homestart Cowdenbeath, Christmas Lights in Cowdenbeath and Lochgelly, and Lochgelly High School Pipe Band.

These projects have supported the aims of the 4 Winds Charity to;

- conserve the local environment,
- support community facilities and community groups in order to promote and encourage community spirit
- support and encourage recreational and educational activities within the community.

We have a scoring matrix which ensures that all applications are considered equally and consistently. The vast majority of applications are successful with only a handful not being eligible for an award. Unsuccessful applications will be offered an explanation and encouraged to resubmit.

Quarterly payments should have been made by RES for Little Raith Windfarm Ltd as have always been paid from 4 Winds inception. Instead, RES group made a lump sum towards the end of the financial year in March 2022. RES Group 'paused' the payments to 4 Winds until 4 Winds had replaced resigned trustees and new trustees were found (within a number of weeks in 2021). For the majority of 2021-2022 4 Winds had to utilise money accrued from the previous financial year to give out to local community groups. The 4 Winds trustees did again request RES Group to pay in quarterly instalments. Despite the changes, money was still given out to the 4 Communities who were still feeling the acute effects of the Covid Global Pandemic. Community applications were lower this year as groups struggled to meet.

#### Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves
Details of any deficit

The amount paid by Little Raith Windfarm Ltd to 4 Winds was determined in accordance with Scottish Government guidance on payments by renewable energy companies to community groups and was specified in the initial agreement between Little Raith Windfarm Ltd and 4 Winds. RES Group continue to request 4 Winds sign a new agreement for Little Raith. 4 Winds have consulted with legal services to find a way forward and come to an agreement with RES.

Going forward 4 Winds trustees

**Donated facilities and services (if any)**None

The charity does not yet have an established policy regarding reserves.

The charity does not have a deficit.

At the end of the financial year 2022, the 4 Winds gave out £29,547 It was agreed by the trustees that payments should return to quarterly. The trustees met over Zoom during the pandemic these funds will continue to be donated to community groups through our grant scheme dependent on applications.


